He has taught, researched and guided research in many institutions and universities including Presidency College, Kolkata, University of Cambridge (UK), University of Bristol (UK), Cornell University (USA), Trent University (Canada), Roskilde University (Denmark), where he was Guest Professor and Danish Research Academy, and Maison de Sciences de 'Homme, where he was Visiting Director of Studies in the Ecole des Haute Etudes en Sciences Sociale, and Curtin University of Technology, Australia, where he was Haydn Williams Fellow for 2005. He was formerly Reserve Bank of India Professor of Economics and Director, Centre for Studies in Social Sciences, Calcutta. He acted as the official historian of State Bank of India until 1997.

He is currently Chancellor of Tripura University, a member of the Court and the Executive Council of Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi. He is on the editorial board of several national and international journals.

Some of his books include **Private Investment in India 1900-1939** (1972), **The Political Economy of Underdevelopment** (1982), a four-volume history of the State Bank of India (1987-97) starting with the **Evolution of the State Bank of India, Parts I and II** (1987), republished in a one-volume edition as **The Evolution of the State Bank of India, Vol. I, The Roots 1806-1876**, by Penguin Books in 2006 and the latest **Colonialism and Indian Economy** (Oxford University Press, New Delhi, 2010).
